Nemont recently sat down with department heads at Sheridan Memorial Hospital Association (SMHA) to discuss how much technology is required for HealthCare today. As technology evolves, so does HealthCare and its many facets.

At SMHA, we discussed many areas where technology is needed and used daily. To be compliant with the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, all healthcare providers were required to implement of electronic medical records. This needed to be in effect by January 1, 2014. By mandating this, Nemont stepped up to provide service that could handle the load due to these changes.

SMHA provides many healthcare services to its community members and its surrounding areas. Some of these services include TeleHealth, Radiology, eEmergency, ePharmacy, Laboratory and Health Information Management.

TeleHealth allows the specialist to come to the patient. SMHA can connect to providers from all over the nation via TeleHealth; however most are through Billings Clinic and the U.S. Department of Veterans' Affairs (VA). Through the VA Primary TeleHealth Outreach Clinic at SMHA, Veterans' are able to connect with VA services without driving long distances to a VA Clinic. TeleHealth also has the functionality of using TeleMedicine. TeleMedicine is used for a variety of specialties such as Cardiology, Nephrology, Dermatology, Mental/Behavioral Health and much more. SMHA also utilizes the TeleHealth connection for employee trainings.

SMHA does not have a staffed Radiologist so they send all radiology studies out to be read. The evolution of technology helps make this possible. In the past, an x-ray would be printed on film and read against a light. Today, the entire process is digital. Any x-ray, CT scan, Mammogram, Ultrasound, MRI, etc. are performed at the facility and sent via the PACS (Picture Archiving and Communications System). The off-site Radiologist will read the image and digitally report the results directly into the patient's chart.

eEmergency offers immediate, real-time support for providers in the Emergency Room and CCU. This service can be used for emergent or non-emergent situations, such as a second opinion or medical questions. A simple push of a red button will connect SMHA to Avera in Sioux Falls, SD where they can provide medical services, offer advice, coordinate Med Flights, or anything the provider needs at that moment.

ePharmacy helped SMHA answer another federal mandate for patient safety, which stated a pharmacist had to review all dosages given to a patient. As there is no full-time, on-site pharmacist at SMHA, ePharmacy connects SMHA to distant pharmacists who review medications before distributed to the patient. Each remote pharmacist confirms the "5Rs" which are: right patient, right medication, right dose, right time and right route. They also check to make sure there will be no adverse reaction to the patient with any additional medication they are taking.

SMHA has several instruments in the laboratory that aid in the diagnosis and treatment of patients. These instruments are directly connected to SMHA's electronic health record system, Cerner. Once the lab is complete, the results are transferred to the patient's electronic medical record.

Cerner is the electronic medical record system used at SMHA. It allows physicians, mid-levels, nurses and other authorized users to share data and streamline processes across an entire organization. An online, digital chart displays immediate, up-to-date patient information. It retains a footprint of each user who pulls the chart to view the patient's health information.



All healthcare providers were required to implement of electronic medical records. This needed to be in effect by January 1, 2014. By mandating this, Nemont stepped up to provide service that could handle the load due to these changes.

Health Information Management repors to different entities to confirm that SMHA is improving quality of care and providing safe, efficient care to its patients. Data is reported to the Performance Improvement Network and QualityNet using standardized measures of care. The facility's performance is benchmarked with peers across the state and across the nation measuring the processes of care in different areas of healthcare based on diagnosis, patient safety, emergency room and inpatient care.

WHAT DO RAILROAD TRACKS, HIGHWAYS, AND FIBER NETWORKS HAVE IN COMMON?

All three of the above infrastructures are considered life-changing projects for the United States. By 1900, much of our nation's railroad system was in place; it cleared the way for the settlement of the West, provided new economic opportunities, and stimulated the development of communities. In the 1950s and 1960s, the new Interstate Highway System brought business to the towns it went through while towns far from the new faster roads struggled to survive. Today, fiber networks have become as essential to business growth, and everyday life in general, as railroad tracks and highways were in the previous century.

The huge impact of fiber is even more amazing when you consider just how tiny fiber is; each strand of glass is only about the size of a human hair. Fiber uses light to transmit data and is unique in its ability to transport virtually unlimited bandwidth over long distances. It's the only technology that delivers enough bandwidth — reliably and at a low enough cost — to meet the ever-increasing demand for more robust internet, video, and voice services as well as other applications.

When fiber networks come to smaller cities and rural communities, it helps level the playing field and close the urban-rural technology gap. Existing businesses can access the internet speeds and reliability needed to expand e-commerce. Economic development organizations have an easier time attracting new businesses. Telemedicine programs can expand patient access to specialists.
